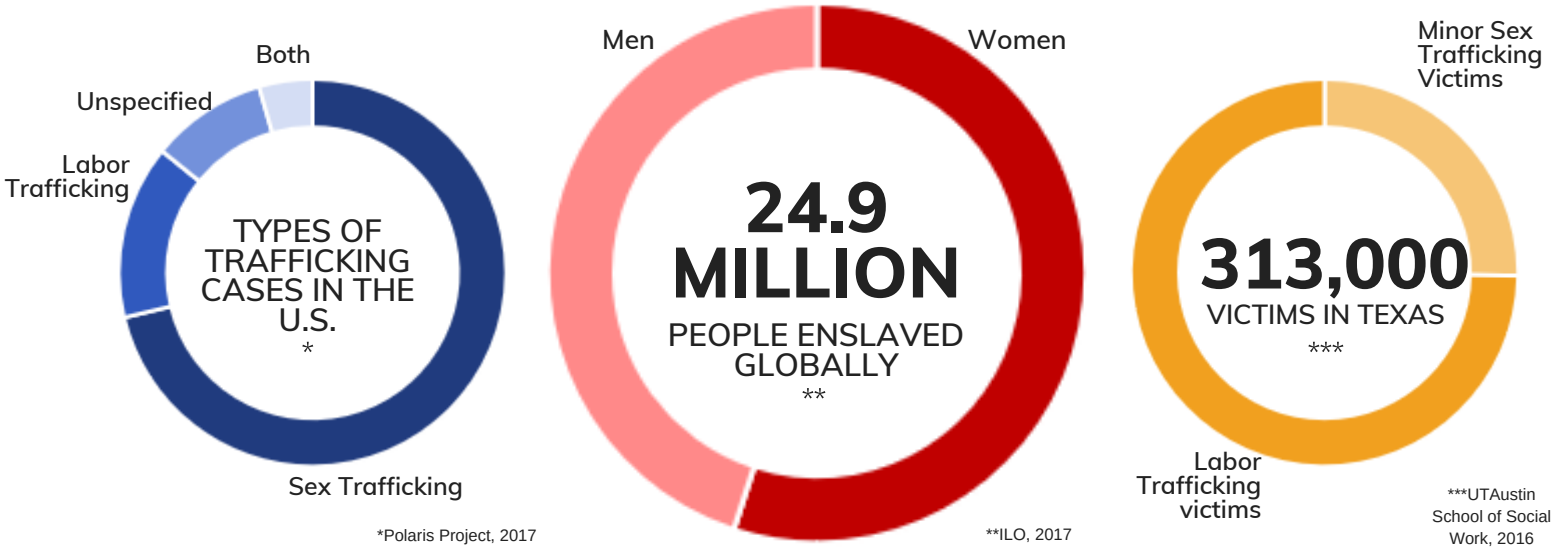




# UNITED AGAINST HUMAN TRAFFICKING

Ending human trafficking through preventing exploitation, educating the community, and empowering survivors



Trafficked persons are subjected to **force, fraud, or coercion** for the purpose of sexual or labor exploitation by the actions of recruiting, harboring, transporting, providing, obtaining, soliciting, and/or patronizing.

## FORCE

Physical method to manipulate and control

- Physical Restraint
- Physical Harm
- Sexual Assault
- Monitoring & Confinement

## FRAUD

False offers that induce people into exploitive situations

- False Romantic Relationship
- Debt Bondage
- Placed in a Job Other Than What Was Promised

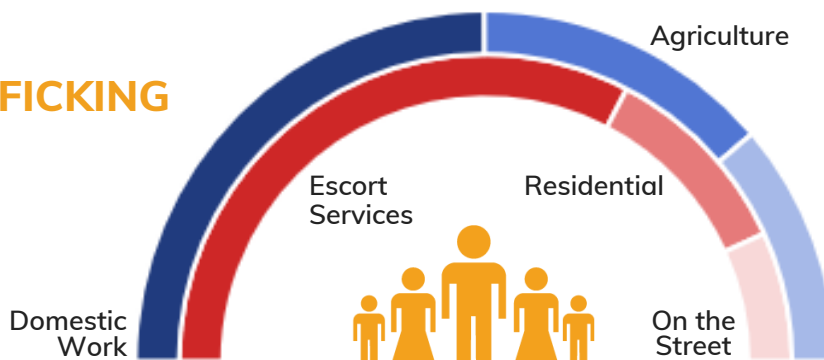
## COERCION

Threats compelling an individual to remain in a situation

- Deportation Threats
- Blackmail
- Confiscate Personal Documents
- Threats Against Family Members

## LABOR TRAFFICKING

- Restaurants / Bars
- Hotels / Motels
- Agriculture
- Domestic Work
- Traveling Sales Crews
- Oil & Gas



## RISK FACTORS

- Exposure to other forms of violence
- Recent migration/relocation
- Substance use
- Runaway/homeless youth
- Mental health concern
- Involvement in systems

## RED FLAGS

- Inability to leave job/living situation
- Evidence of mental/physical abuse
- Tattoos/branding marks
- Accompanied by a controlling person
- Fearful/Lack of eye contact
- Lack of identification

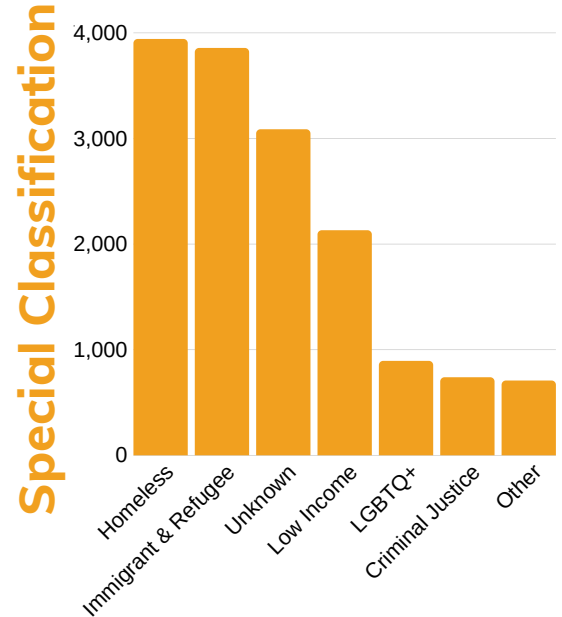
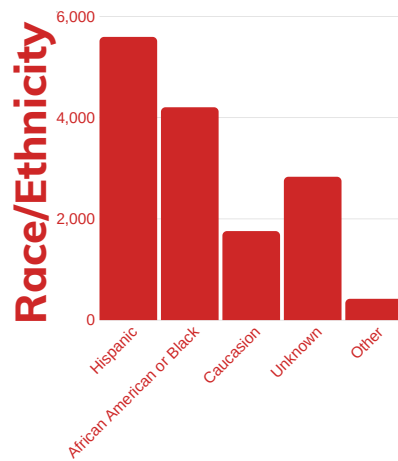
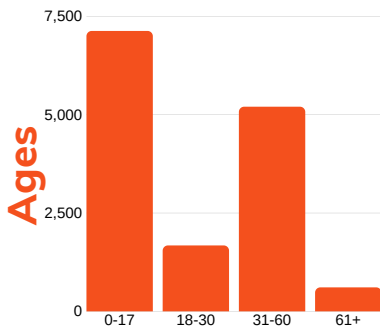
## RECRUITMENT TACTICS

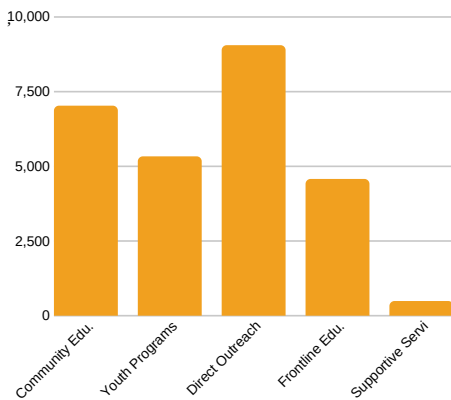
## PROGRAMS DEMOGRAPHICS

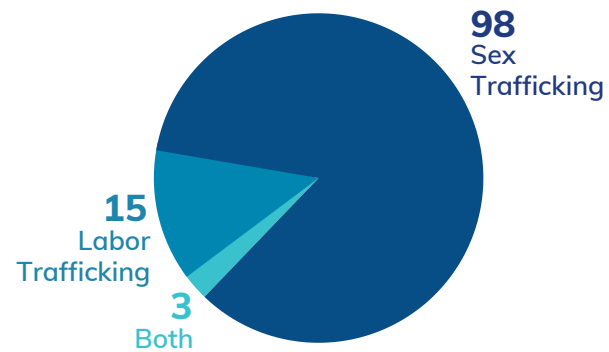
